### SEEKING COUNCIL SEAT

The 2008 campaign has begun. Charles Lewis, founder of Ethos Music Center, says he'll run for Commissioner Sam Adams' seat.

Lewis worked on Adams' 2004 campaign, creating his Web site in the primary. Now Lewis says he wants a shot at improving the city. He points to Bobby Kennedy as a hero and says he is "symbolically picking up a fallen torch . . . to help struggling families and people on the margins of society."

Lewis is a political rookie, but his résumé shows he could be a guy to watch for. He has a master's degree from Harvard in public policy. He served in the Peace Corps and built houses for Habitat for Humanity. He founded Ethos to get music education to school kids who lack it, and he started Portland Duck Tours, an amphibious bus tour. That said, he'll have a nearly impossible task if Adams runs for re-election. At the same time, Adams is widely thought to be the leading 2008 mayoral candidate if Potter doesn't run again.
